


### Improved or typo fixed.

The "Getting Started" page walks the user through an installation of APISIX using Docker. It is however mentioned here that these Docker images are not official ASF images and users should always build from source.

There isn't a link to other installation methods in the "Getting Started" page.

There isn't an "Installation" page but instead "How to build Apache APISIX" which might be misleading as readers might think that it would be a guide to build the source for say, development purposes.

### Solution

Proposal:

1. Change "Getting Started" to "Quick Start" and make the intent clear that it is a guide to quickly run APISIX and test/play-around with it.
2. Add more internal links to the new "Quick Start" guide pointing people to other installation methods and end-to-end guides (future).
3. Change "How to build Apache APISIX" to "Installation" and provide a comprehensive guide on installing APISIX via different methods.


